



#### 07.00 P.M. WELCOME RECEPTION AT THE ZENTRUM PAUL KLEE

On June 20, 2005, the Zentrum Paul Klee opened its doors to visitors and art lovers from all over the world. At the heart of this new cultural institution is the life and work of artist Paul Klee (1879-1940). Today, Paul Klee, who was also a musician, teacher and poet, ranks as one of the 20th century's most significant artists. The Zentrum Paul Klee, in Berne, where the artist spent half of his life, is already considered a monument of international renown and a personal tribute

For this centre of excellence on all matters relating to Paul Klee, a traditional museum is not what the commissioned world-renowned Italian architect, Renzo Piano, had in mind to create. Renzo Piano's in-depth involvement with the entire project included his respect for the terrain of the eastern outskirts of Berne where the complex is located. It is this landscape that gave him the idea to create a spacious island of green from which the architecture would emerge in the form of three undulating waves. The resulting Landscape Sculpture, in its entirety, has become a focus of interest and a destination in its own right.

#### STEP TO STEP THROUGH CHARMING BERNE


Take a tour of the Matte district on the banks of the river Aare, an imposing yet cosy «village» with its fascinating natural waters and climatically favoured vegetation.

# CITY OF BERNE

#### **INFO BERNE**

Berne was founded in 1191 by Duke Berchtold V of Zähringen as a western bastion to protect his territory. The city was extended in various stages (Clock Tower by 1218, Prison Tower 1256, Christoffel Tower 1344). In 1353 Berne entered the Swiss Confederation.

underlined by hundreds of geraniums which decorate the windows of the old town in summer. Everything looks so colorful that Berne was awarded the prize of Europe's most flower decorated city. The area of agglomeration of Berne is 184 km² (62 sq. miles) and it has a population of approximately 300'000.











After the Great Fire of 1405 - when most of the mainly wooden buildings were destroyed -Berne was rebuilt in sandstone. The medieval townscape created at that time has been largely preserved to this day. It is on account of this unspoiled appearance that Berne was declared a World Cultural Heritage by Unesco. Between the 14th and the 16th century, Berne reached the zenith of its power, when its political influence was considerable. 1528 the Reformation. 1798 invasion by French troops and collapse of the Ancien Régime of Berne. In 1834, Berne became a university city. In 1848 it was granted the status of the Federal Capital of Switzerland. The city is also capital of the state of Berne (the country's second largest state).

The city lies at an altitude of 542 m (1777 ft). The population of Berne is approximately 130'000 and the area of the municipality is 52 km² (20,3 sq. miles) of which about a third comprises public parks and woods. This affinity of the city of Berne for a green surrounding is also

As the Federal Capital of Switzerland, Berne is the seat of the diplomatic corps and international organizations including the Universal Postal Union (a specialized agency of the United Nations). Berne's varied industrial and commercial activities cover such key sectors as machinery, metal, electrical equipment, telecommunication, rotary printing presses, pharmaceuticals, textiles, chocolate, foodstuffs, the graphics industry, banking and insurance.


